1. COURSE PREFIX and NUMBER: **ADJ 128** CREDIT HOURS: 3
2. COURSE TITLE: **Patrol Administration and Operations**
3. PREREQUISITES: ADJ 100, Survey of Criminal Justice
4. COURSE DESCRIPTION: Studies the goals, methods and techniques of police patrol with focus on the norms which govern work behavior in a police career. Examines the responsibilities of administrators and field supervisors of patrol in the local and state law enforcement agencies. Lecture 3 hours per week.
