## COURSE OUTLINE

1. COURSE PREFIX and NUMBER: **ADJ 227** CREDIT HOURS: 3

2. COURSE TITLE: **Constitutional Law for Justice Personnel**

3. PREREQUISITES: None

4. COURSE DESCRIPTION: Survey the basic guarantees of liberty described in the U.S. Constitution and the historical development of these restrictions on government power, primarily through U.S. Supreme Court decisions. Reviews rights of free speech, press, assembly, as well as criminal procedure guarantees (to counsel, jury trial, habeas corpus, etc.) as they apply to the activities of those in the criminal justice system. Lecture 3 hours per week.

- c. Constitutional Constraints on Law Enforcement
- d. Impact on Law Enforcement as a Result of Supreme Court Decisions
