COURSE TITLE: Fundamentals of Design I

PREREQUISITES: None

COURSE DESCRIPTION: Explores the concepts of two- and three-dimensional design and color. May include field trips as required. Lecture 2 hours. Studio instruction 4 hours. Total 6 hours per week.
