**Course Title:** American Sign Language V

**Course Description (including lecture hours, lab hours, total contacts)**

Develops advanced American Sign Language comprehension and production skills. Emphasizes advanced linguistic aspects of ASL. Presents ASL literary forms. Encourages contact with the Deaf Community. The fifth course in a 6-semester sequence. Prerequisite: ASL 202. Lecture 3 hours per week.

**General Course Purpose**

To develop advanced-level ASL conversational fluency and provide students with meaningful interactions exemplifying Deaf literature.
