Course Prefix and Number: CST 110

Credits: 3

Course Title: Introduction to Speech Communication

Course Description (including lecture hours, lab hours, total contacts)

Examines the elements affecting speech communication at the individual, small group, and public communication levels with emphasis on practice of communication at each level. Lecture 3 hours per week.

General Course Purpose

CST 110 (formerly SPD 110) develops skills in public speaking, provides opportunities for self-expression, and promotes understanding of oral communication among large, groups, small groups, and individuals. Upon successful completion of the course, the student will have completed at least three projects involving interpersonal, small group and large audience presentations.

- a) The principles, theories and practical skills related to effective communication
- b) The competencies need to develop messages, decode nonverbal messages, provide appropriate feedback, manage barriers and listen effectively
- c) The design and creation of various types of public presentations
- d) The management of effective group processes
