J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College (JSRCC) is dedicated to assisting students in obtaining resources to finance their education. Funding for scholarships is provided by the J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College Educational Foundation, the College Board, clubs, community organizations, businesses, and private individuals.

By completing a JSRCC scholarship application form, students will be considered for all available scholarships for which they meet the eligibility criteria. The criteria differ with each scholarship. Scholarship application forms are available in the Financial Aid Offices (all campuses), Access Centers (all campuses), Student Government Association Offices (all campuses), and the Scholarship Office (Central Administration Building, Room 300, adjacent to the Parham Road Campus). The scholarship application is also included in the Admissions Application Packet, or you can download the form from www.reynolds.edu/scholarship.

The following minimum criteria must be met to be considered for a JSRCC Scholarship:

- Students must have a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA
- Must be enrolled in a curricular program at Reynolds
- Students must have a current and complete scholarship application on file in the JSRCC Scholarship Office

Scholarship applications are current for one year from the date received in the Scholarship Office. After that, students must reapply to be considered for future scholarship funds.

Scholarship applications must be complete. In order to be considered, the application must include:

- Signature of the student applying for a scholarship
- At least one letter of recommendation from a college faculty member or employer (not a family member)
- Previous official college and /or high school transcripts (unless you are a current student and have already completed 12 semester credits at JSRCC)

Scholarships are awarded based on a scoring process, a combination of cumulative GPA, and scholarship application points.

Scholarship applications are evaluated on appearance, spelling, grammar, letters of recommendation, and the answers to the four questions on the application. A volunteer scholarship committee made up of dedicated individuals review each application.

Endowed Scholarships

Endowed scholarships are established with a contribution of \$50,000 or more and allow the J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College Educational Foundation to invest the endowed monies to provide scholarships in the future. At the end of each year, the investment income is awarded to students according to the criteria established by the donor.

Allison and James Aman Memorial Endowed Scholarship

This scholarship was established by the friends and family of Dr. Allison Aman. Dr. Aman joined the college faculty in 1974 and served as program head for biology on the Downtown Campus from 1976 until her death in January 1983. James, husband of Dr. Aman, supported the scholarship during his lifetime and upon his death left a legacy gift to further endow the fund. To be eligible for this scholarship, students must be enrolled in a science curriculum or in the School of Health Sciences program at the Downtown Campus. They must have a minimum 3.2 cumulative GPA and have completed at least 12 semester credit hours of nondevelopmental coursework that is applicable to the curriculum. Students must have completed three or more semester credit hours of science or mathematics courses (with prefix BIO, CHM, NAS, and MTH) with a "C" or better.

Lillian Amburgey Reentry/ Hermitage Women's Club Scholarship

The Lillian Amburgey Reentry/ Hermitage Women's Club Scholarship is made possible by the Hermitage Women's Club. Applicants must have a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA and should not be holding a full-time job. This scholarship was established for women who need to upgrade or acquire new job skills in order to reenter the job market after the loss of a spouse, divorce, or other change in family financial condition. Women seeking to pursue a career after raising children are also encouraged to apply.

Art Scholarship

The Art Scholarship was established to encourage students to pursue a career in the field of art.

Association for Corporate Growth Scholarship

The Association for Corporate Growth is an international association founded in 1954. The mission of the association is to promote the professional interests of its members by offering quality programs and education to enhance members' professional skills. The current membership of the association is 4,000 individuals representing 2,100 companies that manufacture a wide range of consumer and industrial products as well as firms that supply related services. The Association for Corporate Growth's Richmond Chapter has established a scholarship to support students interested in pursuing a career in business. Eligible students must reside in Virginia and be recent high school graduates.

Auto Paint Supply Company, Inc.

The core culture of Auto Paint Supply Company has been to raise the level of professionalism in the auto body industry. To that end this scholarship is to be awarded to the student who has chosen to make a career of the auto body program and best exhibits the integrity and the desire to raise his or her own personal standards, as well as the standards and integrity of the auto body industry.

Barnes & Noble Bookstore Scholarship

Established by Barnes & Noble Bookstores for students attending JSRCC, this scholarship is awarded to students who received the highest scholarship scores and are not currently receiving financial aid or other scholarships.

George and Mae Bartek Memorial Scholarship

The Mae and George Bartek Memorial Scholarship was established by an employee of JSRCC in memory of his parents. The Barteks were committed to helping others, and this scholarship will provide assistance to students who would like to continue their education.

Bay Diesel and Generators Scholarship

Bay Diesel and Generators, located in Chesapeake and Richmond, has offered worldwide diesel and generator sales, service, and parts for over 20 years. The company has four divisions: marine and industrial engine repair, turnkey installation and service of electrical power generation systems, OEM, and aftermarket diesel and generator parts.

Bay Diesel recognizes the need for trained diesel mechanics in today's marketplace. In partnership with the Diesel Technology Program at JSRCC, Bay Diesel offers a scholarship to a deserving student. Students must be currently enrolled in the Diesel Technology Program with a grade point average of 3.0 or better. Students must have an expressed interest and desire to continue to work for Bay Diesel upon graduation.

Nelson Beane Memorial Scholarship

The Nelson Beane Memorial Scholarship was established in honor of a dedicated J. Sargeant Reynolds College Board member. This scholarship is given to a student who has exhibited academic excellence.

Berkeley Hotel Hospitality Scholarship

The Berkeley Hotel is committed to assisting students who wish to continue their education in hospitality management. This commitment is demonstrated through the establishment of the Berkeley Hotel Hospitality Scholarship with JSRCC. Students must have completed 12 semester credits or more in HRI courses and have a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average. This scholarship is for part-time and full-time students.

Bon Secours Richmond Health System Scholarship

Bon Secours Richmond Health System is a healthcare provider serving Central Virginia. A three-time winner of Working Mother Magazine's Top 100 Employer List, Bon Secours provides nurses with a wide variety of employment options and clinical experiences, home health, primary care, and many other diverse operations. Bon Secours is one of the largest employers in the Greater Richmond area. Reflective of the company's overall commitment to prepare the next generation of healthcare professionals to serve the people of Central Virginia, Bon Secours established this scholarship to assist students with completion of the program in registered nursing that leads to full-time job placement with Bon Secours. To be eligible for the scholarship, applicants must have completed or be enrolled in NUR 111 with a grade of "C" or better and work a minimum of 20 hours per month at Bon Secours while completing their studies. After the scholarship recipient receives his/her nursing license from the state of Virginia, the recipient must work full-time for Bon Secours for one year. Up to two scholarship awards per student may be awarded.

John Augustine Boothe Memorial (PAVE) Scholarship

The Program for Adults in Vocational Education (PAVE) is a special training program for adults with mild mental disabilities. PAVE, a nontransferable career studies program, provides post-secondary training that incorporates academic instruction, job skills training, and community-based internships. It is a transition option that increases the level of success, confidence, and competence in work skills. The John Augustine Boothe Memorial Scholarship enables PAVE students to pursue a post-secondary education training program that will provide them with employable skills. Only those students participating in the PAVE program are eligible.

Becky Briggs Memorial Scholarship

Established in 1990 by the Western Henrico Rotary Club, this scholarship provides a permanent memorial to Becky Briggs, daughter of a Western Henrico Rotarian. Students are selected on the basis of commitment to community service and scholastic achievement. Preference is generally given to Interact Club members (Rotary-sponsored) at Douglas Freeman, J. R. Tucker, and Hermitage High Schools.

Sara Bruehl Memorial Scholarship

Sara Bruehl was a 1999 graduate of Atlee High School whose life ended tragically in a drive-by shooting just shortly after she graduated from high school. Sara loved making life beautiful so this scholarship was created to support other horticulture students who do not have the resources to pursue their education.

S. A. Burnette Endowed Scholarship

This scholarship was established to honor Dr. S. A. Burnette, who served as president of JSRCC from 1976-2002. Dr. Burnette is a native of Sandston, Virginia, and a graduate of Highland Springs High School. He obtained his bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees in chemical engineering from Virginia Tech. He provided leadership to the community college system for over 37 years. The college became the third largest community college in the Virginia Community College System during his tenure as president.

Capital Relocation Group Scholarship

The Capital Relocation Group Scholarship was established by the Capital Relocation Group, which specialized in helping to relocate corporate transferees with a minimum of uncertainty and anxiety. In today's competitive labor market, company benefits can be the make or break criteria for candidates to accept a position. The Capital Relocation Group offers a no-cost value added benefit to your company's new and existing employees. Because of the commitment of the Capital Relocation Group to encourage individuals to continue their education in the field of business administration and hospitality management, the Capital Relocation Group Scholarship was established. Students must be majoring in these two areas, complete 30 semester credits or more, and have a minimum 3.0 cumulative grade point average.

Central Virginia Nursery and Landscape Association Scholarship

The Central Virginia Nursery and Landscape Association consists of 76 members who are committed to improving and expanding the field of horticulture. To promote this commitment, the Central Virginia Nursery and Landscape Association has established a scholarship, which encourages students to pursue a career in horticulture. Students must reside in Central Virginia and be pursuing a degree in landscape design or horticulture. Preference is given to those individuals planning to work or those who have had prior work experience with a firm who is a member of the Central Virginia Nursery and Landscape Association.

Artie M. Church Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established in memory of Artie M. Church by her granddaughter. As a teenager, Artie was awarded a college scholarship of her own, but she instead chose to focus her energies and talents on motherhood, making her family's happiness her life's mission. In her memory, opportunities can now be provided to others. To honor her love of family, preference for this scholarship will be given to single parents who are in-state and have a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point average.

Brian Cho Memorial Scholarship

Biology instructor Dr. Brian Cho taught at Reynolds for four years before losing a battle to cancer in September of 2007. To continue the work he loved, his mother Phyllis started a scholarship in honor of her son. The scholarship will be awarded to a student majoring in Biology or Science.

Circuit City Scholarship

This scholarship was established by the Circuit City Foundation for a student in the Computer Information Systems curriculum. Students must have graduated from a City of Richmond high school.

Jason C. Collins Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established in memory of a young man who was pursuing a career in law enforcement while attending JSRCC. Students considered for this scholarship must be majoring in Administration of Justice with preference given to Hanover County residents.

Community Memorial Healthcenter Auxiliary Scholarship

The Community Memorial Healthcenter Auxiliary was established in 1954 and is dedicated to meeting the needs of the community. The Auxiliary identified the needs of those students in the allied health field commuting from the counties of Brunswick, Lunenburg, and Mecklenburg to JSRCC. To be eligible to apply for this scholarship, students must be enrolled in an allied health curriculum and be commuting from one of the counties listed above.

Community Pride High Achievement Program Scholarship

The Community Pride High Achievement Program Scholarship was established by Johnnie Johnson, president and CEO of the Community Pride Food Stores, a Richmond-based grocery chain. This scholarship is an outgrowth of the Community Pride High Achievement Program and was initiated by Mr. Johnson and Richmond Public Schools as a way to improve students' grades, attendance records, and access to college. Students must be incoming freshmen who are planning to enroll in a business curriculum and who will be graduating from a high school in the Richmond City Public School District.

Covenant Woods Nursing Scholarship

Even though Covenant Woods is a new retirement community, its history dates back to 1883. From the beginnings as the Richmond Home for Ladies to the new full-service community of today, serving older adults has remained a core mission and value. The Methodist and Presbyterian founders had resident independence, comfort, service, and peace of mind as primary goals. The early leaders set a standard of stewardship of resources and an approach to care that Covenant Woods strives to emulate today.

Covenant Woods was opened in 2001 in Hanover County and immediately recognized the shortage of certified nursing assistants within the community. The Covenant Woods Nursing Scholarship was established to provide financial assistance to individuals wishing to pursue a career in nursing.

Dennis Foundation Scholarship

JSRCC and Woodfin Oil Company are dedicated to assisting students in furthering their education. The Dennis Foundation has established this scholarship for dependents of former employees of the Dominion Oil Company or those presently employed by Woodfin Oil Company.

Michael David Dobbs Memorial Scholarship

The Michael David Dobbs Memorial Scholarship was established by the Dobbs family to honor the memory of Mike, a graduate of Hermitage High School and Bridgewater College. Mike was an avid runner and participated in cross country and track at both schools. He was a communications major at Bridgewater, enjoyed doing things with friends and meeting new people.

Beginning with the 2008-2009 academic year, \$1000 will be awarded to a student in need of financial assistance in order to continue their education. The student must be a graduate of Hermitage High School and must have completed at least 24 credit hours with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better. Full and part-time students are eligible.

Doenges Memorial Scholarship in Respiratory Therapy

The Doenges Memorial Scholarship was developed to honor the memory of Mr. Christopher W. Doenges and his brother, Dr. John P. Doenges. Both men were victims of lung cancer. Mr. Christopher Doenges was the father of a local respiratory therapist, and Dr. John Doenges initiated the first respiratory care department in rural Illinois. This scholarship award is made possible through the generosity of the Doenges family. To apply for this scholarship, you must be a rising second-year student in the respiratory therapy program at JSRCC. GPA, clinical competence, attendance, and leadership will be considered to determine the best overall candidate for scholarship.

Dominion Foundation Scholarship

On behalf of the Dominion Foundation, a scholarship was established to provide assistance for City of Richmond high school graduates. Students of all majors are encouraged to apply.

Dual Enrollment Scholarship

To encourage high school students to continue their education at JSRCC, the Educational Foundation established a Dual Enrollment Scholarship. This scholarship is awarded to several high school seniors who complete dual enrollment courses while attending high school. These courses meet their high school and college requirements.

Eastwood Scholarship for Young Professionals

The Eastwood Scholarship provides a \$1,800 renewable scholarship to be awarded to a high school senior who has shown the capacity to do outstanding work and who has pursued advanced studies while attending high school. The scholarship is designed to further the student in achieving his/her goal in attaining a degree in a professional field. The Eastwood Scholarship is intended for students who have demonstrated scholastic achievement and financial need. Preference will be given to Atlee High School students participating in the Dual Enrollment Program.

Enterprise Rent-A-Car Auto Body Scholarship

Enterprise was founded in 1957 as Executive Leasing in a cramped office in the basement of a St. Louis car dealership. Though it was not a common practice back then, founder, Jack Taylor, had a visionary idea that consumers would see the benefits of leasing automobiles rather than buying them. His critics, however, thought leasing would never work. Yet, through an unrelenting commitment to personal service and by demonstration leasing's many advantages, he proved the skeptics wrong...and their first venture took root. Today, Enterprise Rent-A-Car is the largest rental car company in North America.

The Enterprise Rent-A-Car Foundation was established to allow the company to give back to the communities where Enterprise customers and employees live and work. The Enterprise Rent-A-Car Foundation established the Auto Body Scholarship to support students pursuing a career in this field and to help remove barriers for these students pursuing higher education.

Ethyl Corporation Automotive Scholarship

Ethyl Corporation, a major international business headquartered in Richmond, Virginia, makes petroleum and specialty industrial chemical, plastic and aluminum products, and has interest in coal, oil, and gas. The Richmond Research and Development Center is one of two laboratories operated by Ethyl Petroleum Additives, Inc., and supports research and development activities by EPA. The center houses chemical and analytical labs, as well as three mechanical laboratory wings with engine and bench test cells, plus engine buildup areas, a fuel blend house, and an industrial waste treatment building.

To support those students interested in the Automotive Technology and/or the Diesel Mechanics Technology Programs, Ethyl has established the Ethyl Corporation Automotive Scholarship. To apply, students must be enrolled in the Automotive Technology or Diesel Mechanics Technology Programs and have completed at least 12 credits of nondevelopmental coursework towards the curriculum at the time the award is effective. Final selection will be based on an interview.

EWI Adult Students in Scholastic Transition Scholarship

Executive Women International Richmond Chapter established this scholarship to provide direct assistance to adults in transitional situations who, for varied reasons, need funding or assistance for education to achieve career goals. EWI is committed to assisting individuals who are facing some form of transition in their lives such as a homemaker entering the job market for the first time, an adult recently out placed due to restructuring or cutbacks, an adult making a career change; or an adult faced with change necessitated by family or personal crisis.

Firestone Automotive Scholarship

The Firestone Automotive Scholarship was established to provide monies for those students pursuing careers in automotive technology. Students must have the recommendation of the JSRCC Automotive Program head to be considered.

Flagler Foundation Nursing Scholarship

The Flagler Foundation Nursing Scholarship was established to provide monetary aid to students in an effort to decrease the shortage of qualified nurses in our region. The Flagler Foundation, established in 1963, is a private family foundation based in Richmond, Virginia. The Foundation focuses its gifts primarily in the areas of education and social services with an emphasis on women and young people. Eligible students should be enrolled in the Nursing program. Awards are given on the basis of academic achievement.

Thomas J. Fleischer Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established in memory of Thomas J. Fleischer and provides full tuition to the selected recipient. Students must meet the general scholarship program requirements to be considered.

George H. Flowers, Jr. Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established in honor of George H. Flowers, Jr. to assist aspiring Mechanical or Electrical Engineering students. Mr. Flowers was a man who loved his family, his church and the Richmond community. He believed passionately in education for everyone. After working and serving in the US Army during World War II, Mr. Flowers went on to start two successful businesses. The later being a waste-to-energy manufacturing business located in Mechanicsville, VA. George Flowers was known for thinking futuristically, studying advanced machines and how to control them. He was sometimes mildly frustrated by his lack of formal engineering background when confronted with technical problems but would quickly turn such roadblocks into opportunities. Recipients of this award should be enrolled in the AS degree in Engineering program and have completed at least 24 program credits with a minimum overall GPA of 2.5. Preference will be given to students residing in the Greater Metropolitan Richmond area with intentions of transferring to VCU to major in Electrical or Mechanical Engineering.

Ford Asset Program Scholarship

This scholarship program was established for students pursuing a career in the automotive industry. Students must have the recommendation of the JSRCC Automotive Program head to be considered.

James Bauer Funkhouser Memorial Scholarship

The James Bauer Funkhouser Memorial Scholarship was established to honor an educator and a dedicated servant of the Commonwealth of Virginia. Dr. Funkhouser, who died in 1983, was a native of Indiana. He served as a major in the U.S. Army in North Africa and Italy during World War II with the 45th General Field Hospital Unit, which originated at MCV. He received the Bronze Star. After the war, he moved his family to Richmond and was chief of psychiatry at McGuire Veterans Administration Hospital. Dr. Funkhouser served for many years in the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation and was its deputy commissioner from 1957 until his retirement in 1979. During his career, he was an expert consultant in the interpretation of brainwaves, an associate professor of psychiatry at MCV, and a lecturer in psychiatry at VCU. Continuing education was important to him, and he requested that his epitaph read simply, "Reverentiam Scientiae Habebat" (He Revered Knowledge). Dr. Funkhouser and his wife Gene had three children: John, Alice, and Laura. The scholarship is a gift from Alice (Funkhouser) and George Flowers.

Dimitri and Maggie Georgiadis Endowed Scholarship

For Dimitri and Maggie Georgiadis, the United States is not their native country. From their own experiences, they realize that mastery of the English language is extremely important for new arrivals to this country who wish to be effective, productive, and happy. Lack of proficiency in English will inhibit newcomers in taking full advantage of the great opportunities offered by this country. Dimitri and Maggie hope that through this scholarship, some individuals may more easily reach their goals of becoming productive and successful members of this country.

General Scholarship

The General Scholarship is funded by individuals who make gifts of \$1,500 or less to support scholarships for students attending J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College. Scholarships awarded from the General Scholarship fund are based on academic excellence and financial need.

Robert and Lucille Gordon Scholarship

The Robert and Lucille Gordon Scholarship was established by Sovereign Bank in memory of Robert L. Gordon, Jr. Mr. Gordon was a charter member of the JSRCC Board and remained active for a number of years. Mrs. Gordon served on the JSRCC Educational Foundation Board, as well as the JSRCC Scholarship Committee. Students applying for this scholarship must be enrolled in the business program, have sophomore status, and possess a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA.

Grace Hospital Alumnae Association Scholarship

The Grace Hospital Alumnae Association is a very active association interested in assisting nursing students pursue their careers. The Association established this scholarship to provide support for nursing students attending JSRCC. Academic excellence and financial need is taken into consideration.

L. Michael Gracik, Jr. Accounting Scholarship

Sharon Mallory, a former student of JSRCC, established this accounting scholarship in honor JSRCC Educational Foundation Board member, L. Michael Gracik, Jr. Sharon Mallory was a reentry student who decided to quit her job and go to college full-time to achieve her personal and professional goals. This was a financial sacrifice for Sharon and her family, who depended on her salary to meet their expenses. Ms. Mallory established this scholarship to honor Mr. Gracik who was her mentor and supported her decision to return to school. This scholarship is available to students over 30 years old who are majoring in accounting or business administration and who have a cumulative GPA of 2.5-3.5.

Robert T. Greene, Sr. Memorial Scholarship

Richmond native, Dr. Robert T. Greene, Sr., served as provost of the Downtown Campus of JSRCC for approximately 18 years. A leader in the community, Dr. Greene was a strong advocate for the expansion of educational opportunities for young people. Dr. Greene's passing in November of 1996 left a great void in the educational community. This scholarship is a tribute to his commitment to the educational success of students on the Downtown Campus. To be considered for this scholarship, applicants must be enrolled at the Downtown Campus and have graduated from a City of Richmond high school. This scholarship is for students whose cumulative GPA is between 2.0 and 3.0. Students must be enrolled in a transfer program and not be receiving financial aid. The Greene family encourages personal involvement as student mentors.

Nathan and Sophia Gumenick Family Scholarship

Nathan S. Gumenick was a pioneer in the field of real estate. He was responsible for building and managing apartments and homes throughout his native Virginia and in the state of Florida. Nathan Gumenick, along with his beloved wife, Sophia, was one of the country's most generous philanthropists. His many charitable gifts reached out to various educational, religious, and medical institutions. This scholarship follows Gumenick's legacy of commitment to the field of education. It will be joined with his other generous achievements at the University of Richmond, Medical College of Virginia, the College of William and Mary, and the University of Miami in Florida. Students enrolled in a business program are eligible to apply for this scholarship.

Gwathmey Foundation Nursing Scholarship

The Gwathmey Foundation established the Gwathmey Foundation Nursing Scholarship to help meet the shortage in our community for Licensed Practical Nurses and Registered Nurses. Students must be enrolled in one of these programs and maintain a 2.0 cumulative GPA.

Hanover Female Assertiveness Scholarship

This scholarship is made available by Dr. Ralph Swingle. The Hanover Female Assertiveness Scholarship is available for a female resident of Hanover County who is attending or planning to attend JSRCC.

HCA Cares Healthcare Scholarship

The HCA Cares Healthcare Scholarship program was created to establish an educational opportunity program for workers displaced since September 11, 2001. The program enables qualified, displaced individuals who are now seeking work to enroll in some of the country's top nursing and medical technology schools. Previous health care experience is not necessary. Students must be enrolled in the LPN Transition or Registered Nurse Program.

HCA-Retreat Hospital Scholarship

In an age of look-alike hospitals, Retreat Hospital stands distinctly apart. As Richmond's very first hospital, Retreat has been caring for patients longer than any other area hospital. Today, Retreat offers an unusual blend of traditional acute-care services and progressive new programs. Programs such as Wound Healing, Mind-Body Medicine, Geriatrics, and more give Retreat a look like no other hospital in Richmond—a look that is distinctly Retreat. This scholarship was established to assist students in completing the registered nursing program that leads to job placement within Retreat Hospital. To be eligible for this scholarship, applicants must have completed or be currently enrolled in NUR 111 with a grade of "C" or better and work a minimum of 40 hours per month at Retreat Hospital while completing their studies. Students also must work full-time for one year for each year that the scholarship is received. This program emphasizes Retreat's commitment to fostering the next generation of healthcare providers.

Dennis and Hanh Hellenguard Endowed Scholarship

The Dennis and Hanh Hellenguard Scholarship was established to assist students enrolled in any certificate or degree program, and is available regardless of national test scores or scholastic average. The purpose of the scholarship is to assist students in learning a marketable skill. The scholarship provides sufficient funds to cover one year of in-state tuition, books and fees. There is no limit to the number of years a qualified student may apply for the scholarship.

Henrico Business Council Business Scholarship

The Henrico Business Council is a program of the Greater Richmond Chamber of Commerce. Founded in 1987, the Henrico Business Council has over 1,200 participants. It is considered the voice of business for Henrico County and can boast that it was instrumental in the elimination of the Business, Professional and Occupational License tax on Henrico businesses. The Council is active in the community in a variety of areas, including government affairs and education issues. The Henrico Business Council sponsors a yearly legislative reception, supports K-12 public education through tutoring/mentoring programs, and is a major sponsor of the Teacher of the Year for the Henrico County Public Schools.

In an effort to encourage high school students to seek careers in business, the Henrico Business Council establishes the Henrico Business Council Business Scholarship at JSRCC. The program will award eight \$500 scholarships for Henrico County High School seniors who matriculate to J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College. The recipient must have a 3.0 cumulative GPA and plan to major in business administration or computer information system.

Henrico Doctors' Hospital Nursing Scholarship

As individual facilities, the 340-bed Forest Campus and the 200-bed Parham Campus have each achieved very visible success on their own. Now as a unified hospital, they complement each other, and are poised for even greater success.

Current and new employees now enjoy a stronger sense of 'team' throughout the hospital—more room for their careers to grow; more opportunities for professional development and advancement; and a closer spirit of camaraderie with each other and with patients. They also enjoy a more intimate relationship with senior administration, which includes the best managers from both campuses.

To be eligible for this scholarship, registered nursing students must have completed or be currently enrolled in NUR 111, willing to sign a work agreement, and participate in a paid internship program at the hospital.

Josephine Holcomb Memorial Endowed Scholarship

This scholarship was established in memory of Dr. Josephine Holcomb, who served as chairperson of the Division of Humanities and Social Sciences at JSRCC.

Thomas F. Hughes Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established in memory of Thomas F. Hughes and provides full tuition to the selected recipient. Students must meet the general scholarship program requirements to be considered.

Hutchens & Hutchens Legal Assisting Scholarship

The Hutchens & Hutchens Legal Assisting Scholarship is awarded to deserving legal assisting students attending JSRCC. Students must have completed LGL 110, Introduction to Law and the Legal Assistant, with a grade of "B" or higher. Academic achievement and financial need factors will be taken into consideration.

JSRCC College Board Scholarships

The efforts and generosity of the JSRCC Board make it possible for one student in each of the 25 area high schools to receive this scholarship. Students must have a minimum of 3.0 cumulative GPA for the College Board Honors Scholarship and at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA for the College Board Achievement Scholarship. Only one scholarship is awarded to each of the high schools in the area. It can be either for honors or achievement. The high school must complete the College Board Nomination Form to designate the recipient.

Ladysmith Volunteer Fire Auxiliary Scholarship

The Ladysmith Auxiliary of Caroline County established the first Fire Science scholarship for students in 2007. A member's son that completed the Fire Science program had such a positive experience at the College that he encouraged his mother and the Auxiliary to create a scholarship. This award is given bi-yearly to a student majoring in Fire Science with preference given to a Ladysmith or Caroline County resident.

Linwood Jacobs Achievement (Wal-Mart) Scholarship

The Linwood Jacobs Achievement Scholarship was established by the Richmond based stores of Wal-Mart, Inc. This scholarship is an acknowledgement of the distinguished service, collaborative college/community activities, and sustained mentoring provided by Dr. Linwood Jacobs, dean of Student Development Services, during his tenure at JSRCC.

Robert Lane Memorial Endowed Scholarship

The Robert Lane Scholarship was created in memory of the college's first program head for Automotive Technology. The scholarship will provide full-time tuition for two semesters for a student entering or enrolled in the Automotive Technology Program at JSRCC. To be eligible for the scholarship, students should be enrolled in or have completed at least 12 semester credits in the program, including one technical course. A graduating high school senior or a high school graduate who is/was actively participating in a high school automotive program and who plans to enroll full time in the college's Automotive Technology Program is also eligible to apply.

Legal Assisting Scholarship

This scholarship is made available by the Richmond Association of Legal Assistants. Students must be enrolled in the Legal Assisting Program to be considered.

Liberal Arts Scholarship

The Liberal Arts Scholarship was established for a second-year student enrolled in the liberal arts curriculum who has at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA. Academic excellence and service to the community are factors taken into consideration. This scholarship alternates between students at Downtown and Parham Road Campuses each year.

Eric and Jeanette Lipman Endowed Scholarship

This scholarship supports the education of part-time and/or full-time students at JSRCC. It is available to anyone contemplating enrollment at the college, as well as current students.

Lowe's Community Scholarship

On behalf of the Lowe's Home Improvement Warehouse and Lowe's Educational Foundation, a scholarship and internship were established for those students attending JSRCC. Those students majoring in horticulture or building-related majors would participate in a paid internship and receive a scholarship to cover tuition, books, and supplies.

Luck Stone Corporation Scholarship

It's rare to find a company that has enjoyed continued success for eight decades, yet has remained family-owned and operated for all that time. Luck Stone is one of those companies. Under the leadership of three generations of the Luck family, Luck Stone is now the largest privately-owned and operated aggregates supplier in the U. S. with more than 900 associates. The Luck Stone Corporation Scholarship was established to assist students enrolled in the automotive, welding, and diesel mechanics programs, while participating in a paid internship with the corporation.

Markel Business Scholars Program

The Markel Business Scholars program was established to address the financial needs of students wishing to pursue a career in the field of Business. The scholarship provides tuition assistance to one student each year majoring in Business Administration. In order to be considered for this award, students must meet the general scholarship program requirements and be planning to transfer to Virginia Commonwealth University upon completion of course requirements at JSRCC.

Ivor and Maureen Massey Virginia Commonwealth Legacy Scholarship

The Virginia Community College Foundation established the Virginia Legacy Scholarship for each campus of the twenty-three community colleges in honor of a leading community philanthropist. JSRCC recipients of this scholarship must mentor an incoming freshman the following year after receiving their scholarship award.

Mathematics Department Scholarship

The Mathematics Department Scholarship was established by faculty members in the mathematics department at JSRCC who wanted to help those students wishing to major in mathematics.

Fred McConnell Engineering Scholarship

In honor of Dr. Fred McConnell, one of the charter faculty members of J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College, a scholarship has been established for students in the engineering program. Dr. McConnell has always exemplified a strong commitment to our engineering students and given much encouragement over the years. His dedication to the civil engineering program has impacted the lives and success of students pursuing a career in this field.

Merrill Lynch, Inc., Scholarship

The Merrill Lynch, Inc., Scholarship was established for students with high academic excellence and focused on continuing their education.

Metropolitan Health Foundation Scholarship

The Metropolitan Health Foundation has quietly worked to improve the health of all people throughout the Greater Richmond area for over ten years. The Foundation has worked to improve nursing instruction at the college by funding audiovisual materials, equipment, and special furniture needed to prepare students for the real world experiences in area hospitals. Additionally, the Trustees have helped deserving students to pursue an associate's degree in nursing at JSRCC through this scholarship. To be eligible, students must be enrolled in the nursing program and agree to work in the Richmond area for one year for each year the scholarship is received. They must have successfully completed NUR 111 with a passing grade of "C" or better OR must be currently enrolled in NUR 111 and obtain a letter from the course instructor stating that the student is doing "C" or better work in both clinical and theory.

Louise Hoyt Minor Scholarship

The Louise Hoyt Minor Scholarship is provided by an individual of modest means who simply wants to provide opportunities for others. Mrs. Minor remembers how her father, who was denied an education, helped his younger brothers and sisters attend college. As a result of his experiences, Mrs. Minor established a scholarship for male high school seniors graduating from John Marshall High School.

Owens & Minor Nursing Scholarship

The Owens & Minor Nursing Scholarship was established for a nursing student attending JSRCC. This scholarship was established to help meet the nursing shortage within the community.

Motorola SPS Scholarship

Motorola is one of the world's leading providers of wireless communications, semiconductors and advanced electronic systems, components and services. Motorola's Semiconductor Products Sector (SPS) designs, produces and distributes integrated semiconductor solutions and components for the customer, networking and computing, transportation, and wireless communication worldwide. Motorola recognizes the importance of education and is delighted to provide assistance, through these scholarships, to students pursuing a technical degree and career.

Stuart and Bland Noel Scholarship

Stuart and Bland Noel were classic examples of perseverance. They believed in a solid work ethic; they didn't expect to have things handed to them on a silver platter. They believed and taught their children to believe that once you set your mind on something that you believe is worthwhile, you should stay at it until you reach your goal. The Noels always said, "Don't procrastinate, don't put it off until some other time, do it now if it needs to be done." This scholarship is provided in their memory for students who believe that pursuing education is worthwhile and who are eager to start working to fulfill this goal.

The Noels were not wealthy people, but they always gave to family and friends in times of need. In keeping with their spirit of generosity, this memorial scholarship has been established to assist students needing financial assistance to support their education.

Nunnally Foundation Middle College Scholarship

The Nunnally Foundation has led the way in local philanthropy by example. In addition to its many charitable contributions to Richmond human welfare, health, and the arts, the Foundation has been instrumental in partnering with JSRCC to provide opportunities for the City's high school dropouts. Through funding the Middle College program at Reynolds, the Nunnally Foundation has exposed these at-risk young adults to a college experience that is life-changing—allowing them to improve their standard of living for themselves and their families. The Nunnally Foundation Scholarships help Middle College students continue beyond their GED at Reynolds with tuition assistance for their initial college courses.

Nursing Endowed Scholarship

This scholarship was established to help address the need for qualified nurses in the Richmond metropolitan area. Many students may become discouraged in pursuing a nursing career because of the cost of taking these prerequisite courses. The strong commitment to assist these nursing students has led to the establishment of this endowed scholarship.

Betty Green Parson Memorial Endowed Scholarship

Betty Green Parson returned to school in midlife and developed renewed energy and enthusiasm as a result of her years at JSRCC. When her life was abruptly cut short by an aneurysm in 1985, her family and friends established the Betty Green Parson Memorial Scholarship in her memory. The criteria for this scholarship require that the student be female and planning to enter or reenter the work force. The student must be at least 30 years old and enrolled in the liberal arts curriculum at the college.

Mary Morton Parsons Foundation Scholarship

The Mary Morton Parsons Foundation has made it possible for several students who are currently attending JSRCC to complete their educational goals. Students must have a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA and have completed a minimum of 12 semester credits. Students must not be receiving financial aid. A strong emphasis is placed on community and school involvement.

Nina K. Peace Memorial Scholarship

The Nina K. Peace Memorial Scholarship was established in memory of Ashland's dedicated leader and community servant. Nina was an active participant in many community agencies and organizations, one of which was the Hanover Rotary Club. This scholarship is given to a student who is majoring in administration of justice.

Pediatric Connection Scholarship

The Pediatric Connection Scholarship has been established in memory of Shelia O'Donnell, a longtime member of the Pediatric Connection family. Ms. O'Donnell was a nurse who touched the hearts of those who knew her with her cheerful smile and the loving care she gave her patients. She will be remembered with great affection by the Pediatric Connection Family. The Pediatric Connection is a children's home healthcare service that provides special care for special children with medical needs. The Pediatric Connection provides the highest quality of care and support for these children at home. To qualify for this scholarship you must be a second-year student in the nursing program. Scholastic achievement and financial needs are considered.

Philip Morris Vocational/Technical Career Scholarship

Philip Morris USA, Inc. established this scholarship to assist students of any age in completing an educational program leading to job placement. Students may be enrolled full-time or part-time in a curricular or certificate program. Applicants must have been out of high school for at least twelve months before applying for the scholarship.

Clyde and Dorothy Pittman Memorial Scholarship

Scholarship criteria to be established.

Pinchbeck Child Care Scholarship

This scholarship was established to support students enrolled in the JSRCC childcare program.

Protech Dental Studio Scholarship

The purpose of the Protech Dental Studio scholarship is to provide financial support for one first-year and one second-year student in the Dental Lab Technology Program at JSRCC. It is given with the hope that these resources will encourage and motivate students to pursue the field of Dental Lab Technology in order to alleviate the severe shortage of trained dental technicians available for employment in commercial dental laboratories. Eligible students should be enrolled in required dental lab courses and will be evaluated on technical ability, academic success, academic need and a narrative explaining their professional goals. Selections are made by an independent committee comprised of Dental Lab Technology faculty, advisory committee members and dental professionals.

Evelyn D. Reinhart Memorial Nursing Scholarship

This scholarship is awarded to deserving students who have been accepted into the nursing program and hold a 3.0 cumulative GPA. Preference is given to a student who is from a single parent family or the first sibling to further their education beyond high school. Recipients must be willing to seek employment as a nurse at a healthcare facility or continue to study nursing at a four-year college upon graduation.

The Reynolds Family Scholarship in Memory of J. Sargeant Reynolds

Known as the Reynolds Family Scholarships in Memory of J. Sargeant Reynolds, the family makes this generous gift in celebration of the qualities embodied in the late J. Sargeant Reynolds, for whom the College is named. By commemorating his outstanding character and unwavering integrity through a gift that fosters this potential in today's young people, the family foundation establishes a permanent scholarship fund.

Richmond Academy of Medicine Alliance Foundation Scholarship

In support of those students pursuing a career in nursing, the Richmond Academy of Medicine Alliance Foundation established a scholarship program for JSRCC students.

Harry and Virginia Ritchie Memorial Scholarship

The Harry and Virginia Ritchie Memorial Scholarship was established by their daughter, a JSRCC administrator, to honor her parents. Mr. and Mrs. Ritchie were devoted parents and helped many people in need during their lifetime. Through this scholarship their service to others can continue in their memory by assisting a student enrolled in a transfer or occupational-technical program at JSRCC, who has also demonstrated service to others.

Paul Rooney Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established to honor Paul Rooney, the brother of a JSRCC retired faculty member. Paul Rooney died at twenty-nine years of age before having an opportunity to complete the community college classes he was taking to provide new direction in his life. Students must be enrolled in the science program at the Parham Road Campus with a minimum 2.8 cumulative GPA. They must have completed at least eight semester credits of nondevelopmental courses towards the curriculum.

Rotary Club of Hanover County Scholarship

The Rotary Club of Hanover County has a strong interest in helping the residents of Hanover County further their education. Because of this dedication, they have established this scholarship. Applicants must be graduates of a Hanover County high school and a current resident of Hanover County.

Rotary Club of Henrico North Scholarship

In response to a recognized community need, the Henrico North Rotary Club encourages individuals to seek self-improvement through higher education and training. To promote qualified individuals to continue their education, the club is proud to sponsor several scholarships. These renewable scholarships are available to graduates or GED recipients from Henrico County Public Schools.

Rotary of Innsbrook GED Scholarship

The Rotary Club of Innsbrook, located in the Innsbrook area of Henrico County, is part of a worldwide network of 21,000 clubs under the organization of Rotary International. Rotary is represented by over one million individuals in more than 150 countries developing humanitarian projects and providing service to others. The Rotary Club of Innsbrook is dedicated to adult literacy and education. The club sponsors partial scholarships to assist those individuals who have completed their high school education through the GED and encourage GED graduates to further their education. An interview may be required.

Rotary Club of West Richmond Scholarship

The Rotary Club of West Richmond and the West Richmond Rotary Club Foundation support community efforts that focus on youth in the Greater Richmond area. The 95 members of the West Richmond Rotary Club represent the Richmond business and professional community and are very generous with their time and personal resources to benefit area youth programs. The Club is proud to sponsor a scholarship at JSRCC to assist a deserving student in achieving their educational goals.

Grace Crank Sargeant Memorial Endowed Scholarship

Virginia S. Reynolds established this scholarship in 1993 in memory of her mother. The scholarship is based on academic excellence.

J. Franklin Sargeant Memorial Endowed Scholarship

J. Franklin Sargeant spent most of his 96 years serving Louisa County. A man of great charm, he was active in politics, senior warden of St. James' Episcopal Church, and well loved by all who knew him. With a spirit of independence that characterized his life as a business and family man, Sargeant continued to live alone, although legally blind, during the last years of his life. He is warmly remembered for his sense of authority, directness, integrity, and his love of life—all qualities inherited by his grandson and the college's namesake, J. Sargeant Reynolds. This scholarship was established by Mr. Sargeant's daughter, Mrs. Richard S. Reynolds, Jr., in 1989. The J. Franklin Sargeant Scholarship is given each year to a full-time student from Louisa or Goochland Counties on the basis of academic excellence. High School graduates during the recent academic year are eligible to apply.

Science Program Endowed Scholarship

JSRCC faculty members who were interested in supporting the students majoring in the science curriculum established Science Endowed Scholarship. Students must have completed 12 semester credits of non-developmental coursework in the science curriculum, must be enrolled in an Associate of Science Program and must have a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA.

School of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences Scholarship

A faculty member, Henry Bartlett, once attended JSRCC and continued his education to receive his doctorate. Dr. Bartlett, with the assistance of faculty and friends, established this scholarship specifically for students enrolled in the School of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences. Students must be in a transfer program with a minimum 3.00 cumulative grade point average.

School of Information Systems, Business and Public Safety Scholarship

In honor of Dr. Jo Ann Sherron, faculty and friends established a scholarship for those students enrolled in programs within the School of Information Systems, Business and Public Service. Dr. Sherron, as a charter member of JSRCC, dedicated many years of service which resulted in the success of the School of Information Systems, Business and Public Safety.

William H., John G., and Emma Scott Foundation Scholarship

The scholarship is awarded based on financial need and academic success.

Sheltering Arms Hospital Nursing Scholarship

Sheltering Arms Hospital is the first not-for-profit freestanding hospital dedicated to the intensive rehabilitation of adults with physical disabilities in Virginia. Sheltering Arms has been serving the Richmond community since 1889. Its mission is to provide needed health care and enhance the quality of life for persons experiencing disability, regardless of the patient's ability to pay. Sheltering Arms provides a variety of services including a day rehabilitation program, a 40-bed inpatient rehabilitation facility, as well as various outpatient locations that provide physical therapy, medical psychology services, physician services, aquatic exercised/therapy, and more.

Sherwin-Williams Automotive Finishes Scholarship

The Sherwin-Williams Automotive Finishes Scholarship was established to assist students enrolled in the auto body technology program. Because the auto body industry is determined to raise the level of professionalism, Sherwin-Williams Automotive Finishes established the scholarship to encourage students to pursue a career in auto body.

Earl Smith Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established to honor a dedicated employee of JSRCC and a resident of Hanover County. Earl Smith was employed with the college for 23 years in the Learning Resources/Media Center. Mr. Smith was a charter member of the faculty of the college and established the Audiovisual Department on the Parham Road and Downtown Campuses. At the time of his death, he was the coordinator of Instructional Support and Media Services. Students applying for this scholarship must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 and a maximum cumulative GPA of 3.5. Applicants must have graduated from a Hanover County High School and be currently residing in the county. This scholarship is for first-year students.

State Farm Auto Body Scholarship

The State Farm Insurance Agency established the scholarship to encourage more students to pursue a career in the field of auto body. Students must be enrolled or plan to enroll in the auto body program.

Clarence and Vivian Stitzer Memorial Internship/Scholarship

Complete Interior Package, Inc. established this scholarship in memory of Clarence and Vivian Stitzer, beloved parents and initial investors in Complete Interior Package, Inc. The Stitzers believed in working hard to reach your goals. In honor of their support of education and strong work ethic, this scholarship aims to assist a deserving student who needs financial assistance while working a paid internship and attending school.

Complete Interior Package, Inc. services the building industry and strives to be an industry leader, continually challenging them to improve every aspect of our business. This scholarship will provide funds for students majoring in Business Administration who want to be challenged and who seek to achieve excellence in all that they do.

Lorraine B. Stopkey Memorial Scholarship

The Lorraine Stopkey Memorial Scholarship was established by the family in her loving memory. This scholarship is awarded to a nursing student attending JSRCC to help meet the nursing shortage in our community.

William A. Sutton Sr. Memorial Scholarship

William was the first African American to rise to the rank of press supervisor at William Byrd Press, which later became known as Cadmus. He retired after 25 years of service to pursue his chosen vocation of residential painting and started his own business, Sutton and Sons Painting, in 1996. Professional and personable, William built his company around the principles of exceptional customer service and impeccable work ethics. He would often send a thank you note or flowers in appreciation of a customer's business. As a result, all of his business was generated by referrals from satisfied customers. This scholarship, established in his honor, fulfills his dream of helping young people get off to a productive start in life. First consideration will be given to a Richmond Public High School senior who exhibits a winning attitude, has shown improvement in their GPA each year, and has chosen to enroll in a vocational program after graduation.

Toyota Automotive Scholarship

Students who are planning to enroll or are currently enrolled in the Automotive Technology Program may be considered for the Toyota Automotive Scholarship. These students should meet with the JSRCC Program Head for Automotive Technology.

Tri-Club Women's Club Scholarship

The Tri-Club Women's Club is interested in females who are reentering college or the work field. Students must have a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA and not be receiving other financial aid. Applicants should be full-time students with preference given to students pursuing a field of study devoted to helping others.

Tyson Family Foundation Scholarship

The Tyson Family Foundation Scholarship was established for students enrolled in community college/technical programs. Students must be enrolled in AAS or certificate programs in the following areas: computer-aided design specialist, computer and electronics technology, electronics, nursing, accounting, administrative support, certified professional secretary preparation, culinary arts, desktop publishing, information systems, management, marketing, and word processing.

Ukrop's Super Markets, Inc., Internship/Scholarship

Ukrop's Super Markets, Inc. established this scholarship and internship program at JSRCC to meet the workforce needs of the community and their stores. Ukrop's Super Markets, Inc., is committed to providing educational assistance for JSRCC students, as well as on-the-job-training in their major. This scholarship/internship program is available for students majoring in food service, information systems, pharmacy tech, and horticulture/floral design.

VAMAC, Inc. Wholesale Distribution Endowed Scholarship

VAMAC, Inc. was established in 1915 as Virginia Machinery and Well Company. Originally located on East Main Street in Richmond, it served as a well drilling, water supply contractor, and a distributor for pumps, piping, and well supplies.

In 1922, Julian G. Perry joined the company and helped lead VAMAC's expansion into wholesale plumbing and heating distribution. Today, VAMAC, Inc. remains a Perry family owned and operated company headquartered in Richmond with 12 profit centers throughout the state. VAMAC, Inc. is committed to devoting its resources to serving its customers and associates. Recognizing that an educated workforce is critical for any distributor, VAMAC, Inc. has established the VAMAC, Inc. Wholesale Distribution Scholarship. This scholarship will provide funds to cover tuition, as well as a paid internship.

Virginia Automotive Service Cooperative Scholarship

The Virginia Automotive Service Cooperative, known as VASCO, is a member owned and operated organization that was established in 1961 by 13 independent services facilities. There are currently 150 members of VASCO located throughout the Greater Richmond Area. The two VASCO warehouses provide quality parts and training to all of its members.

The VASCO scholarship is awarded to a student who has an interest in making the automotive industry his or her career. The student must have completed one semester of the automotive training program, and be willing to participate in an internship during their training. The sponsoring shops of the VASCO Scholarship are Miles Auto Service, Inc., Smith Auto Service, Inc., and Tuckahoe Tire Country.

Virginia Commonwealth Health System Community College Nursing Scholarship

The VCU Health System, the only academic, level one trauma center in Richmond, recognizes the difficulties experienced by nontraditional students attempting to complete an academic program while managing other important life commitments. As a result, the VCU Health System is offering scholarships to registered nursing students at JSRCC.

To be eligible for the scholarship, students must have successfully completed NUR 111. For students in the LPN to RN program who are able to bypass NUR 111, they must successfully complete either NUR 122 or the Psychiatric and OB/GYN Nursing courses. The money can be used to cover the cost of tuition, books, supplies, and other course related expenses. Any remaining funds can be used to cover the costs associated with managing other life commitments such as childcare, elder care, and transportation to school.

Students who accept the scholarship will be expected to work for the VCU Health System for one year following successful completion of the NCLEX and obtaining their RN license. Scholarship recipients will be asked to make this commitment in writing and will be required to repay the money if they are unable to complete school and/or fail to fulfill the work requirements.

Virginia Commonwealth Health System Community College Respiratory Therapy Scholarship

The Virginia Commonwealth Health System Community College Respiratory Therapy Scholarship was established to assist those students pursuing a career in respiratory therapy. The students must be second-year students and agree to work for the Virginia Commonwealth Health System one year for each year they receive the scholarship.

Virginia Hospitality and Travel Industry Scholarship

This scholarship is made available by the Virginia Hospitality and Travel Industry. The student applying for the Virginia Hospitality Scholarship must be currently enrolled in Curriculum 240 or Curriculum 235 (Specialization 02) and currently employed in a Virginia lodging property. The student must have a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA.

Virginia Military Institute Transition Scholarship

The VMI Alumnae Club of Richmond established this scholarship to support those students who wish to attend VMI but who need to improve their grade point average in order to be admitted to the Institute. This scholarship is open to high school seniors in the metropolitan area scheduled to graduate during the current academic year and have received the recommendation of the VMI director of Admissions.

Virginia Nonprofit Housing Coalition Scholarship

The Virginia Nonprofit Coalition (VNHC) provides affordable housing to the residents of Forest Brooke Apartments, Foxwood Apartments, and Randolph Village in Richmond, Virginia. VNHC is committed to providing a positive living community for its residents.

VNHC has established a scholarship program to enable qualified dependent student residents to pursue a college education. A VNHC scholarship representative is available to work with eligible students and their families toward successful college enrollment at selected area colleges.

Wachovia Bank Scholarship

This scholarship has been established by Wachovia Bank for a student attending JSRCC. This scholarship reinforces the bank's commitment to promote development within the communities it serves. Students applying for this scholarship must be first-year; full-time students who graduated from high school or received a GED within the last two years. Applicants should have a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA with preference given to first generation college students. Recipients will be assigned a mentor who will contact the students on a regular basis.

Mary Washington Hospital Foundation Nursing Scholarship

The Mary Washington Hospital Foundation, located in Fredericksburg, Virginia, exists to support the operations of MediCorp Health System. Each \$2,000 scholarship is being offered to increase the number of highly qualified nurses in the MediCorp Health System Family.

Individuals receiving a scholarship agree to apply for employment at MediCorp Health System upon graduation. In the event that the scholarship recipient chooses not to work at MediCorp Health System or secure licensure, the scholarship reverts to a loan and must be repaid.

Alan Waters Memorial Scholarship

Alan Waters, 24, of Glen Allen, Virginia was a student in the J. Sargeant Reynolds Automotive program. Alan was also a graduate of Hermitage High School and participated in the automotive program at their technical center. His passion was cars and working on cars so he looked forward to the opportunity to professionally and skillfully repair cars as his vocation. To honor his memory and passion the Alan Waters Memorial Scholarship Fund was established in order to keep Alan's dream and passion alive so others could be equipped to service the automotive industry.

Westminster Canterbury Scholarship

Several residents of Westminster Canterbury wanted to help current employees pursue their life dream while they were employed at Westminster Canterbury. The Westminster Canterbury Scholarship would provide the financial support for these employees to continue their education and reach their career goal. Students may be employed part-time or full-time, but must be in a curricula program and maintain a 2.00 cumulative grade point average.

Lettie Pate Whitehead Foundation Scholarship

The Lettie Pate Whitehead scholarship program provides scholarships and grants to schools and colleges to support deserving female students. Lettie Pate Whitehead was a well known philanthropist with a dedication for helping those in need, contributing to numerous charities in Georgia and Virginia throughout her lifetime. Scholarships are awarded to female students with financial need pursuing A.A.S. degrees in Nursing at JSRCC.

Margaret Ellis Whitesel Scholarship

Margaret Ellis Whitesel grew up on her father's dairy farm in Henrico County. For 41 years she served as an elementary school teacher in the Henrico County Public School System. Preference is given to Louisa County residents; however, the recipient must be from the Richmond Area.

Wholesale Distribution Scholarship

This scholarship was established by several leaders in the wholesale distribution industry. As a result of the dedication and generosity of these individuals, several scholarships are available to any student planning to attend or currently attending J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College. Students should enroll in wholesale distribution courses offered as an option in the Business Management Program. Students must be enrolled in business or a business related curriculum with a cumulative GPA between 2.5 and 3.0. Two scholarships will be provided. Preference is given to Hanover County residents. An interview is necessary, and there is a mentoring program for the recipients.

John H. Wilton, Jr., Memorial/ Home Builders Association of Richmond Scholarship

Established by the Home Builders Association of Richmond, a residential construction trade association, this scholarship honors the memory of John H. Wilton, Jr. Mr. Wilton was an outstanding member, officer, and friend. He died tragically in a racing accident in 1993. Applicants must be full-time students with a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA. They must demonstrate a willingness to participate in HBAR community service projects. Preference is given to students enrolled or planning to enroll in industry related courses.
