J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College is the third largest community college in the Virginia Community College system. Students are enrolled at three major campuses, one off-campus site, and “virtually” through distance learning. The college is committed to providing and maintaining a safe and secure environment for all members of the college community.

The colleges’ Department of Police uses the community-policing model to create partnerships with student, faculty, and staff. We recognize that partnerships and collaboration with our college community members helps to keep the college environment safe.

Campus police enforce all state laws and college regulations. The Police Department is also responsible for preventing, detecting, and investigating any criminal activity on the campuses owned or leased property.

A Chief of Police who is responsible for providing professional law enforcement services to our community manages the Campus Department of Police. Campus police officers have the same authority and obligation to exercise police power as other state or municipal police officers. The JSRCC Police jurisdiction includes all college owned and leased property and the adjacent streets and sidewalks to college owned or leased property. Our Campus Police Officers also work with our surrounding local jurisdictions of Goochland County, Henrico County, and the City of Richmond, along with State and Federal agencies.



All Campus Police Offices are sworn and certified by the Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services. In addition, the Department of Police utilizes non-sworn personnel to provide security and escorts at each of our campuses. Our security officers attend the Campus Security Officers course provided by the Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services. Our security personnel provide our community with an additional security presence, responding and assisting our police officers when necessary.

The College Safety Manager is responsible for drafting policies and conducting college wide inspections to ensure the college is in compliance with all local, state and federal safety regulations. The safety manager reports to the Chief of Police

The Downtown Campus is located at 700 E. Jackson Street, in the City of Richmond, Virginia. The campus is a six story building that sits in the downtown district of the city. The campus is convenient to public transportation and is within walking distance to the Coliseum, City Hall, and other Richmond attractions.

Department of Police staff patrols the building, rear-parking deck, parking lots A and B located in the 500 block of 7th Street, and adjacent streets. In addition, the Department of Police patrols the faculty and staff parking area located in the Navy Hill Deck in the 700 block of Navy Hill Dr.

The Department of Police is located in room 122 on the first floor lobby of the Downtown Campus.



The Parham Road Campus is located at 1651 E. Parham Road in a suburban setting. The campus sits on 105 acre site in the county of Henrico, Virginia. The campus consists of the Massey Library Technology Center, Georgiadis Hall, and Burnette Hall.

The Department of Police headquarters is located in Burnette Hall room 100. The Police Department also patrols the Central Administration Building located at 1701 E. Parham Rd, and the Northrun Building located 1624-1630 E. Parham Road in the County of Henrico.

The Goochland Campus is located at 1851 Dickerson Road in a rural setting in the County of Goochland, Virginia. The campus consists of two instructional buildings.

The Department of Police is located in the lobby of building C-20.



The Ginter Park Center is located at 3406 Brook Rd in the City of Richmond. The Center is within a residential area of the City accessible to public transportation.

The Ginter Park Center opened in August 2010 and consists of three leased buildings, Lingle Hall, Newberry, and Dubose. The center functions as swing space during the renovations of the Downtown Campus. Parking for the Center is located along Brook Road or in the JSRCC leased parking lot on Westwood Ave.

The Department of Police is located in the rear lobby of Lingle Hall.

J. Sargeant Reynolds Department of Police is responsible for compiling and publishing the college's annual safety report. This document is intended to serve as the annual safety report, as required by the U.S. Department of Education and the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act. The purpose of this report is to provide information about security on campus to include campus and community crime statistics, safety information, policy information, safety tips, resource phone numbers and a brief overview of the many services the college provides. Information is from reports provided by Campus Security Authorities including, but not limited to, the Department of Police, and the Division of Student Affairs. Statistics included are from law enforcement agencies with property adjacent to the college, which include the Henrico County Division of Police, Richmond City Police Department, and the Goochland County Sheriff's Office. J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College is committed to providing the college community and visitors with the safest and most secure environment possible; however, even the most extensive initiatives cannot succeed without the awareness and cooperation of the community members who work and study on campus.

Reynolds Alert

The Department of Police works closely with the Office of Marketing & Public Relations to ensure that members of the college community are notified immediately about security situations and crimes that may represent a threat to students and employees. This system may be used by J. Sargeant Reynolds to immediately notify students, staff, and faculty during a major crisis or emergency. Reynolds Alert delivers important emergency alerts, notifications and updates to you on all your devices below, but registration is required.

As appropriate, notices are also made on JSRTV Comcast Channel 96 as well as posted on bulletin boards and entrance doors.

Code Blue Phones

Emergency Code Blue Phones are safety devices placed throughout all our campuses and the Ginter Park Center. Each code blue phone has an emergency activation button that will send an officer immediately to the site when activated. There is also an information assistance button to request non-emergency information from the Department of Police.

Crime Prevention Programs

The Crime Prevention Unit is responsible for conducting Security Assessments and providing programs to inform students and employees about the prevention of crime. The Department of Police offers various security awareness programs 2 – 4 times per year, which includes, but is not limited to

Escort Services/Safe Rides

The Department of Police provides escort services or safe ride services to students, faculty, staff, and guests upon request. This service is available on all campuses during regular hours of operation Monday through Saturday from 7:30 am to 10:30 pm by calling 804-523-5219 or using the information button on the Code Blue phones.

Criminal Offense Log

In accordance with the regulations of the Clery Act, a campus criminal offense log is maintained by the Department of Police. Interested persons may request to access this information at any of the Department of Police locations.

Shuttle Services

The Department of Police provides shuttle transportation services by non-sworn personnel. There are three main shuttle services. One shuttle serves the Downtown and Parham Road campuses. Another shuttle serves between the Downtown campus and the Ginter Park Center. The third shuttle serves between the Downtown campus and parking lots A, B, and the Navy Hill Deck.

For the safety of our passengers and drivers, shuttles are subjected to video and audio recording.

Need assistance or report a crime

JSRCC Department of Police staffs communication officers to receive your call during school hours. Emergencies should be reported to JSRCC Police (off-campus or cellular phone) at 804-523-5911 or (from a college phone) 5911. All emergencies, criminal acts or questionable behavior should be reported immediately to the Department of Police by telephone or by using one of the emergency call boxes strategically located around each campus. You do not need to leave your name or number when reporting a crime or incident.

Emergency Response and Evacuation Procedures

J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College maintains and updates the emergency preparedness plan accessible through the college website at <http://www.jsr.vccs.edu/security/documents/EmergencyPreparednessPlan.pdf>. The Department of Police recognizes that some emergency may require the evacuation of students, faculty, and staff these emergencies include, but not limited to fire alarms, power outages, equipment failures, chemical spills, etc. In addition, some emergencies require students, faculty, and staff to seek shelter in a predetermined location as outlined in the emergency preparedness plan or maintain a shelter in place. A shelter in place requires a student, faculty, staff, or visitor to seek shelter in a classroom or office that can be locked and secured. These emergencies may include, but not limited to an active shooter, armed subject, chemical spill, or other event where leaving a secured area may involve unnecessary risk of injury or death. Shelter in a predetermined location may be sought in the events such as severe weather. The Department of Police, along with the Marketing Division, will distribute alerts for evacuation; seek shelter, or shelter in place by various methods that may include Reynolds Alert, Virginia Community College Systems email, JSRCC internal email, in person, news media outlets, Comcast channel 96, and bulletin boards. The Department of Police and Marketing will determine the appropriate method of distributing necessary information.

Timely Warnings

Timely warnings are issued under the direction of the Chief of Police with the consultation of the Vice President of Finance and Administration when information is confirmed that constitutes an ongoing or continuing threat. These threats may include crimes such as; murder, manslaughter, forcible and non-forcible sex offense, aggravated assault, burglary, motor vehicle theft, arson, and crimes involving prejudices. The method to notify students, faculty, and staff of timely warning information may include; college email system, Reynolds Alert system, poster/signs, and electronic message boards. The Vice President of Marketing and Public Relations in consultation with the Chief of Police and/or the Vice President of Finance and Administration will determine the distribution method.

Access Control

J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College Department of Police is responsible for maintaining access control to the buildings and campus grounds. While JSRCC is an opened community college, some classrooms, such as labs, stay locked until the instructor arrives. In some instances, the Department of Police will respond to provide access into the classroom only when the instructor is present. Some instructors have key authority as outlined in policy 4-36, *Employee Access to College Facilities*. The college police department maintains staffing to respond to emergencies or events, such as alarms during non-business hours.

Victim Witness Program

The Department of Police is dedicated to assisting and providing services to victims and witnesses of crime, as governed by the Virginia Crime Victims Bill of Rights. The department's goal is to ensure that victims and witnesses are provided as much assistance as necessary. The goal is to reduce the impact of crime on victims, and witnesses through awareness of available services.

Victims or witnesses of a crime, have certain rights under the Virginia's Crime Victim and Witness Rights Act. However, there are specific steps that must be taken to receive these rights. The department of police encourages everyone that has become the victim of a crime to come forward and report the crime to the police. However, on occasion and depending on the nature of the crime, the victim may elect to refuse to press charges, regardless if a report is filed.

The college will, upon written request, disclose to the alleged victim of a crime of violence or non-forcible sex offense, the report on the results of any disciplinary proceeding conducted by the college against a student who is the alleged perpetrator of such crime or offense. If the alleged victim is deceased as a result of such crime or offense, the next of kin of such victim shall be treated as the alleged victim for purposes of this paragraph.

Drug and Alcoholic Beverage Regulations

J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College prohibits the illegal use of alcoholic beverages by students on campus, and enforces all applicable state laws and college policies relative to alcohol violations. Although there is a procedure for students of legal drinking age to gain permission to serve alcohol at college-sponsored events, all local, state, and federal laws as well as college policies must be followed. Individuals who consume alcoholic beverages are responsible for their own behavior. Students violating laws or college policies are subject to disciplinary action. College employees are also expected to follow college alcohol policies as well as Department of Human Resource Management policies and state law.

In accordance with the federal Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988, the federal Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act of 1989, and the state Policy on Alcohol and Other Drugs, J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College prohibits the unlawful or unauthorized manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession or use of alcohol and other drugs by employees and students in the workplace, on college property or as part of any campus activity. Employee or student violators are subject to disciplinary action, up to and including termination of employment, expulsion, referral for prosecution and referral to an evaluation or rehabilitation program. *See JSRCC Policy # 1-35 (revised 6/28/2011) and Alcohol and Other Drugs Policy (DHRM policy # 1.05).*

Sexual Misconduct and Offenses

JSRCC Department of Police is committed to preventing sexual assault. Incidents of sexual misconduct, including rape, sexual battery, and other forcible and non-forcible offenses are violations of state law, as well as J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College code of student conduct, and the state code of employee conduct. Educational programs for prevention of sexual assault are conducted 2- 4 times per

year. Additionally, the topic is covered in orientation sessions for new students. Victims of sexual offenses on campus should contact the department of police immediately for proper reporting, investigation and criminal apprehension.

If you are a victim of a sexual assault at this college, your first priority should be to get to a place of safety. The victim should contact the police immediately and seek medical attention. If you are a victim of a sexual offense on campus and unable to contact the police department, any college official will assist you in notifying the proper authorities. It is important that a victim preserve physical evidence to aid in prosecution of offender(s). While the college does not have a counseling staff, J. Sargeant Reynolds works with victims and assists in obtaining counseling through the local jurisdictions' victim and social services units. Campus Sex Crime Prevention Act

The Campus Sex Crimes Prevention Act, enacted on October 28, 2000, is a federal law that provides for the tracking of convicted sex offenders. The law requires state law enforcement agencies to provide J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College with a list of registered sex offenders who have indicated that they are enrolled, carrying on a vocation, or employed at the college. In the Commonwealth of Virginia, convicted sex offenders must register with "Sex Offender and Sex Crimes Against Minors" registry maintained by the Virginia Department of State Police. Information concerning offenders registered may be disclosed to any person requesting information on a specific individual in accordance with law. Safety Tips

We encourage all students, faculty, staff, and visitors to take an active role in their own safety and security while on campus. Everyone can help maintain a safer environment at the college by following the guidelines listed below:

- Walk in well-lighted and well-traveled areas after dark. Walk with a friend or call Campus Security for an escort.
- Keep yourself informed. Check campus email and bulletin boards for campus alert notices, which pertain to specific security conditions on campus. Take advantage of informational and crime prevention programs sponsored on campus.

- Never study alone in an isolated area of a campus building.
- Lock your car and secure valuables when using campus-parking facilities.
- Become familiar with emergency exits and the locations of fire alarms and fire extinguishers.
- Lock offices when not present. Do not loan keys to anyone.
- Immediately report all suspicious persons, vehicles, or activities to Campus Police.
- Immediately report all crimes, security-related problems, and hazardous conditions to Campus Security.



J. Sargeant Reynolds Police Department utilizes a bicycle patrol at the Parham Road Campus. The department is currently increasing the number of officers certified for bicycle patrol for other campuses and the Ginter Park Center. The bicycle patrol allows an officer to respond quickly to calls for service.

Campus Crime Statistics

The statistical data reported on the following charts is compiled from the records maintained by the JSRCC Department of Police, the JSRCC Director of Student Development and the following law enforcement agencies:

1. Goochland Sheriff's Office
2. Henrico County Division of Police
3. Richmond Police Department

The criminal offenses are classified using the *FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting System* definitions. The "Clery Act" defines the location categories used. Public Property is defined by the U.S. Department of Education as "all public property, including thoroughfares, streets, sidewalks, and parking facilities, that is within the campus, or immediately adjacent to and accessible from J. Sargeant Reynolds Community College." The college has neither "Residential" living quarters nor "Non-Campus" buildings owned by student organizations. The reader should keep in mind that some crime victims may choose not to report offenses to Campus Police or local police authorities, and that violations listed may result in both arrest and disciplinary referral for the same offense. All criminal activity is detrimental to the college community and strong measures, including dismissal are taken against offenders.
